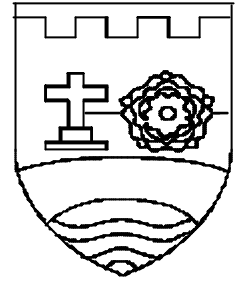

## In the Finals - 2009

The Village, and The Orchard and Church Street, have been nominated to receive awards in their respective categories of the North West in Bloom 2009 Competition. The final results will be announced at the Awards Ceremony held on 22 and 23 October 2009. The Awards Ceremony is a little like the Oscars as, until awards are announced, participants are unaware as to who has won.

The Village was also announced as one of the finalists in the Lancashire Best Kept Village Competition 2009. The Old School, Community Centre, Almshouses, Croston Corn Mill, Subscription Bowling Green, Cricket Ground and village notice boards were also nominated as finalists in their own sections.

A second round of judging was carried out in mid - August and the results will be announced in September. The Parish Council would like to thank all residents who assisted by keeping the area tidy.

Our thanks go to all residents who assisted with both competition entries, and all the members of Croston in Bloom and Croston Residents Environmental Workforce.

The Parish Councils special thanks go to John and Annabel Pearson, Kath Almond, Anne and Martin Peet, Beryl Williams and David Sandwell for all their work with the planting etc.

## Recreation Ground

Having attended to the Village Green seating areas we now intend to move on to our next project - to completely revamp the Recreation Ground area.

On the Young Childrens Play Area we plan to renovate the equipment and fence, and resurface the area, repaint the Youth Shelter and resite it on a solid base with the entrance facing Station Road, provide a Multi-Use Games Area and install 4 low energy lighting columns, which would direct light downwards to cover both Areas and the Youth Shelter.

We also intend to re-establish the hedge to the north boundary, the footpath behind the properties on Station Road, and provide a picnic area on part of what is now the football pitch, which will be replaced with a smaller pitch.

All Residents are invited to comment on our initial proposals, which will be displayed in the Council's noticeboards on the Village Green, and outside the Co-op and Police Station, during late October/early November. Additionally we will have drawings available for inspection, from 7.00pm, prior to the Council meeting on 12 November 2009.

## Chairman's Report

As yet another rather damp summer comes to a close; it is pleasing to hear that the village and several of its buildings and amenities have reached the finals of the Best Kept Village Competition. Let's hope we have a similar success in the North West in Bloom competition. Keep an eye on the Parish Council Notice Boards for the results of both competitions.

On 19 August I attended the official opening of the new fish pass at Mill Coe. This project, undertaken by the Friends of the River Yarrow, has taken 7 years to complete and the committee are to be commended for their hard work and endurance.

Sadly, the grounds of the church have been subjected to two burglaries in recent weeks. Following the theft of 24 York stone flags from the rear of The Old School, the garden store alongside the public footpath was broken into and tools to the value of £2,000 have been taken. Anyone with any information is asked to contact the local Police.

On a happier note, I am pleased to report Councillor John Kearton is making good progress following his recent hip replacement. On behalf of the Council I would like to wish John a speedy recovery and we look forward to his return to Council meetings.

## Pedestrian Safety

The Parish Council's requests, from the Lancashire Highways Allocation Budget 2009, for bollards on the pavement on Town Road, outside the Bank and at the junction with Out Lane have been granted by the Lancashire Local.

The bollards were requested to protect pedestrians from motorists mounting the pavements, which have seen several near misses.

We look forward to the work being carried out and the pavements in these areas becoming safer for pedestrians.

## 110 Bus Service

As a result of lobbying by residents, and Croston and Bretherton Parish Councils, a Monday's-only bus service between Leyland and Southport has been reinstated on a trial basis until 26 October 2009.

The trial will ascertain whether there is sufficient demand for the service to reinstate it on a permanent basis so it may well be yet another case of 'use it or lose it'.

## Croston Acorns Nursery

This year we were fortunate to secure an Early Years Capital Grant for our Nursery.

This grant, for £20,000, was to be spent on all areas within the nursery that would improve the quality of the learning environment and help us deliver the EYFS Curriculum.

We have now reached completion of the project and would like to thank Lancashire County Council, Sure Start Early Years and Childcare Service, and all our Staff and contractors who have helped us with the project.

## Poppy Appeal

Recent news reports of the casualties in Afghanistan should serve to remind us of the sacrifices made by the Members of the Armed Forces and their families.



Last year's Poppy Appeal in the village raised just over £1350 - an increase of around 30% on the 2007 figure!!!

## Digital Switchover

**The Digital Switchover in the Granada TV region begins on 4 November 2009, when the analogue BBC2 signal will cease. On 2 December the remaining analogue channels will also be switched off.**

Residents with Freeview, Top Up TV or BT Vision will need to re-install/ retune their receivers on both dates.

All non digital TV's will need a digibox to receive the channels and these can be obtained for around £20 from most major supermarkets or electrical retailers.

Most homes will not need replacement aerials so don't fall for any sharp sales practice from TV aerial suppliers.
